
Ashwell Primary School Religious Education Curriculum Year 2: Autumn term – Christianity & Judaism



Autumn Term Units: Beliefs and Practices, Symbols and Actions and Identity and Belonging.

Core Knowledge / skills to be acquired:

Symbols and actions; symbolic expression in prayer and worship

- Identify and recognise some symbols of Judaism and Christianity
- Begin to recognise why particular images may have been used as symbols, e.g. light, water, plants
- Draw simple comparisons through the exploration of different religious symbols
- Recognise places where Christian and Jewish symbols might be found, e.g. on religious buildings

Beliefs and practices; religious celebrations, key events in life

- Know some ways in which Christian and Jewish festivals bring people together
- Recognise key aspects of the festival of Sukkot for Jews and know how it is celebrated
- Recognise key aspects of two different festivals of light (e.g. Christmas for Christians and Hanukkah for Jews)
- Broaden knowledge of the story of Christmas and why it matters to Christians
- Begin to understand that for Christians, incarnation is about the birth of Jesus (embodiment/ taking on flesh)
- Broaden knowledge of Easter; knowing what Christians remember and believe when they celebrate Easter Identity and belonging
- Begin to explore what belonging means to a Christian or Jew
- Begin to recognise how faith impacts on a person's identity and belonging

Curriculum Enrichment / Cultural Capital Opportunities

Visitor of faith:

Prior summer term year 1 knowledge / skills this builds on: Sources of wisdom

- Know why the Bible is holy and sacred to Christians and the Qur'an is holy and sacred to Muslims and how followers take care and read their holy books
- Recall some aspects of faith stories and what they teach us about the way people should look after each other and the world





What comes next in year 3:

Symbolic expression in prayer and worship

- Recognise the power and significance of light across religions
- Understand the importance of sharing food in Christian worship

- Describe different Muslim traditions and celebrations
- Understand the significance of birth welcoming ceremonies
- Know how Christian and Muslim followers mark important events in life
- Develop an understanding of what it means to live as a Christian or Muslim.
- Know the meaning behind advent and its links to the birth of Jesus Christ
- Investigate how countries around the world celebrate advent and Christmas

Identity and belonging; exploring religious commitment, communities and leadership

- Explore what it means to belong to a faith community
- Express what belonging and faith means across in relation to Christianity and Islam
- Generate creative ways of expressing our own faith or belief commitments
- Consider some of the challenges individuals and communities face
- Know about the role and duties of historical and contemporary religious leaders Recognise leadership qualities and attributes and identify the impact religious leaders have on their followers
