## Year 2 Non-chronological Reports




- ✓ Navy tracksuit bottoms / leggings / shorts\* / skort

## Year 4 – Rainforest Learning

Year 4 have made a good start to some cross-curricular topic work, by writing Rainforest animal poems in English and designing and making a rainforest diorama as part of our design and technology lessons. The poems imitated the style of Tennyson's *The Eagle* poem, following the structure of that poem and using challenging vocabulary too. The dioramas were made out of a shoebox and natural materials from our meadow area. The children painted the backgrounds and added extra details using other resources such as tissue paper and cardboard. They were very proud to share them in our whole school assembly!


